



Darul Uloom Sayeediya: Building New Horizons

This year, our journey at Darul Uloom Sayeediya took another leap forward as we expanded to three OBE (Open Basic Education from NIOS) levels: Level 1, Level 2, and now Level 3. Today, over 220 students are part of the program, reflecting both its impact and the growing importance of second-chance education.



On 30th November 2024, a special GIANT LEAP workshop encouraged students to speak up, participate in role plays, and build teamwork skills. Even the most reserved students showed new confidence, guided by trainers who offered personal feedback and encouragement.

To sustain this progress, motivational sessions are held regularly to keep students focused on their goals. Counseling programs for parents and students are also conducted periodically, strengthening family involvement and creating a strong support system.



On 13th December 2024, students proudly showcased their creativity and critical thinking at Innovision Day's Science Exhibition. Their projects reflected not only academic growth but also the confidence to present ideas before peers and visitors.



Together, these initiatives—workshops, exhibitions, and counseling—are shaping personalities, enhancing interpersonal skills, and preparing students to face life with clarity and determination. With added support in the form of computers and stationery, our students are now better equipped to step into a brighter future with faith and resilience.

Educational Awareness Camps – Reaching Communities, Inspiring Change

Reaching the Unreached – DJ Halli Government School Visit

On 22nd June 2024, the Learning Point Foundation team, led by Dr. Sarvath Adil Khan, visited DJ Halli Government School to address the critical issue of student dropouts in the community. Staying true to our mission of giving every learner a second chance, we engaged in meaningful discussions with Headmistress Mrs. Nafeesa and her staff to identify barriers such as financial hardship, lack of family support, and limited academic flexibility.

We shared Learning Point's vision of making education accessible through NIOS pathways, awareness drives, and counseling support, ensuring that students who have fallen behind are not left behind. The visit also included open interactions with teachers, parents, and students, helping us better understand their challenges and aspirations.

This outreach was not just a school visit – it was a step towards building trust, inspiring hope, and reaffirming our commitment to bridge the gap between out-of-school children and the education they deserve.



Strengthening Bonds – Mother's Meet Initiative



To build stronger school-home connections, Learning Point Foundation launched the Mother's Meet Initiative – informal gatherings aimed at involving mothers in their children's education. Many of these mothers are first-generation learners or come from conservative backgrounds, making the initiative a vital bridge between families and schools.



The meetings provided a safe and open space for dialogue, allowing mothers to share concerns, understand academic progress, and learn how consistent encouragement can boost attendance, performance, and confidence. These sessions not only empowered mothers but also deepened community trust, making them active partners in their children's learning journey.

Together, these outreach efforts are breaking barriers, fostering community involvement, and ensuring education becomes a shared commitment between schools, families, and Learning Point Foundation.



Learning Point: This Bengaluru-Based NGO Gives School Dropouts A Second Chance

Learning Point, founded by Sarvath Adil Khan in 2018 with only six students, has since expanded to accommodate a student body of 300.



Education, in today's world, is more than just conferring a certificate. It is granting a child an equal opportunity to compete and excel in a fast-progressing world that is only growing every day in ideas and possibilities. It is to equip children with the necessary skills, techniques and information that build in them the confidence to challenge, create, innovate and allow them to contribute towards the betterment of societies and the upliftment of their communities. It is this confidence that Sarvath Adil Khan, founder of Learning Point, talks about when she says, 'I want to give them the gift of confidence, so that they can, at least believe that they too, like every other child, have a right to dream. And then over here, with the help of this project, I want to equip them with the necessary tools with which they can turn their many dreams into a reality.'

Learning Point, located in Bangalore's Tannery Road is an NGO that works to offer youth, struck by fate, a second chance at pursuing their education in various fields, and to make a difference in their lives. The NGO works with school dropouts who had to discontinue their education early to become breadwinners for their families. Learning Point's alumni, of the past four years boasts of children who were formerly working as maids, house helps, waiters, table cleaners, garage boys and are now either successfully placed in decent jobs or are pursuing their higher education as lawyers, paramedics and engineers. The course seeks to offer firstly a basic training in spoken English and then goes on to incorporate the students in an NIOS program. The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) is a government initiative that provides courses and programs up to pre-degree level through open and distance learning mode. The NGO also organises job placements, vocational counselling, teachers training and workshops on women empowerment, computer skills, interview skills, personality development along with scholarship programs.

Learning Point began in the year 2018 with only six students and has now grown to a 300-student strength, with a well-equipped, qualified staff, catering exclusively to youth, single mothers, widows, abandoned women, child laborers and drug addicts who wish to give themselves a second chance at breaking free from their circumstances for a better future. A unique initiative by the NGO is their AEMS (Academic Education for Madrasa Students) program that aims to empower huffaz, alims and students enrolled at madrasas with a formal English education along with personality development and computer courses, without hindering their Islamic education. The program even allows the students to write their exams, three subjects at a time, so as to not overburden their curricula.

'We hope to make madrasas a haven of both Islamic and academic education', their brochure optimistically says. The AEMS program is already being implemented in four madrasas in Bangalore and has yielded vibrant results. The NGO prides itself on a 96.7% pass rate for tenth standard and 98.1% for twelfth standard of which madrasa students too had between 98-100% pass rate.

Sponsored by a few organisations across Bangalore, the NGO was founded by Sarvath Adil Khan, who has nearly seven years of experience in social service. A former parent leader at Oasis International School, Sarvath did not let her early marriage deter her from seeking a higher education for herself. A certified Cambridge trainer with a Masters in Psychology, she has previously served as headmistress in Elegant International School, before establishing her own centre for schooling and service.

'Maybe it was my own circumstances that moved me towards my brainchild, the Learning Point,' she says when asked about her source of inspiration. 'I was married too early, depriving me the chance at education, training and self-reliance. It is only when I pushed myself to study after the birth of my two children that I realised that every school dropout should also be given this second chance at bettering themselves.'

'Parents from poor economic backgrounds enrol their children in a madrasa for many reasons. But the foremost amongst them is that it offers some sort of formal education, free of cost, that allows the child to have at least a meagre income in the future. But as a society we have stereotyped our alims and huffaz to a point that we don't see them beyond their kurta pajamas as individuals who are deserving of respect and opportunities just like other members of the society. All they end up with is having to stand in BPL ration lines for food and less than sufficient incomes while they are only approached by the community on a ceremonial basis.'

LPF Enables Over 400 Youth to Get into Mainstream Education

Learning Point Foundation's relentless efforts in areas around Tannery Road enable dropouts and working youth to clear NIOS exams and move over to sought-after courses.

The Learning Point Foundation (LPF) marked its 10th graduation day by honoring 477 students on Saturday (August 24).

The LPF has been engaged in enabling dropouts to join the mainstream education by coaching them for NIOS exams. As many as 272 students cleared 10th grade NIOS course while 105 passed 12th grade following their participation in coaching programmes conducted by the foundation. Most of these students belong to families along the Tannery Road, areas marked by rampant dropouts and under- as well as unemployment among the youth.

Social worker Sarvath Adil Khan founded the LPF in 2018 with the help of her husband. In the first year she could manage to enroll only six students who started coaching sessions for NIOS in 2019. Soon the numbers ballooned to hundreds. Sarvath, who accom-

pany employ and the like. Her coaching classes are for students from madrasas (Islamic theological schools) which abound in the area. Several graduates show their aptitude degree of 'Master's' from madrasas like Darul Uloom Deoband, Darul Uloom Haqqania, Darul Uloom Haqqania, Darul Uloom Haqqania and Muslim orphans too were enrolled and coached to clear the NIOS 10th and 12th grade exams. Sarvath says, "Students who had dropped out were able to clear the NIOS 10th and 12th grade exams."

Learning Point Foundation Empowering Deprived Youth Through Education


Learning Point Foundation has an ambitious plan for the future of training over 1000 students each year along with assisting them in finding suitable jobs.

NIOS 10th STANDARD PERFORMANCE (2019-25)

In 2019-20, six students (four boys and two girls) appeared for the NIOS 10th examination and achieved a 100% pass rate, even amidst the challenges of the pandemic.

In 2020-21, 47 students, including 17 madrasa boys and 3 madrasa girls, once again recorded a perfect 100% pass rate, reflecting their resilience during a difficult year.

In 2021-22, a cohort of 67 students, comprising 8 madrasa boys and 5 madrasa girls, achieved a 94% pass rate, demonstrating steady progress as numbers grew.

In 2022-23, the student strength increased to 129, including 20 madrasa boys and 41 madrasa girls, who together accomplished a 95% pass rate.

In 2023-24, participation rose further, with 169 students appearing. Of these, 165 successfully cleared the examination, resulting in a 98% pass rate. This included 43 boys and 57 girls from madrasas.

In 2024-25, the Foundation reached its highest enrollment so far, with 206 students attempting the examination. An outstanding 202 students passed, recording a 98.06% pass rate. A significant proportion of these were first-generation learners and madrasa students, underscoring the impact of our interventions in providing a second chance at education.

NIOS 12th STANDARD PERFORMANCE (2019-25)

In 2020-21, 45 students appeared for the NIOS 12th Standard examination, and all 45 successfully passed, recording a 100% pass rate.


In 2021-22, 63 students enrolled, of whom 61 cleared the exam, achieving an impressive 97% pass rate.

In 2022-23, the number of students rose to 98, with 94 passing, resulting in a commendable 96% pass rate.

In 2023-24, 116 students attempted the exam and 113 were successful, maintaining a strong 97% pass rate.


In 2024-25, the Foundation recorded its highest enrollment to date, with 170 students appearing. Out of these, 168 passed, marking an exceptional 99% pass rate.

Overall, across five academic years, the program has sustained a remarkable average pass rate of 97.8%, reaffirming the effectiveness of our teaching model, mentorship, and academic support in guiding dropouts and madrasa students to complete their higher secondary education.

in Obe Level 3 in 2024 -25





OBE LEVEL 3 - 2025

In 2025, the Foundation launched the Open Basic Education (OBE) Level 3 program to prepare learners in the 13-14 age group for the 10th Grade. This initiative has opened a vital pathway for early adolescents to strengthen their academic foundation and progress confidently into higher education. The first batch itself was a resounding success — all 51 students who appeared cleared the examination with a 100% pass rate — setting a strong precedent for the years ahead.

Between 2020 and 2024, Learning Point Foundation enabled 1,167 students to appear for the NIOS 10th and 12th examinations. Of these, 1,137 students successfully passed, recording an exceptional 97.4% overall pass rate.


At the 10th Standard level, 605 students cleared the examination, while 481 students passed at the 12th Standard level. These consistent outcomes highlight steady progress and reflect the strength of our academic model.

Strong results across both onsite learners and madrasa students demonstrate the inclusivity of our approach. With structured guidance and mentoring, students from varied educational backgrounds are excelling in mainstream examinations and preparing themselves for the future.

Importantly, these results go beyond academics. A growing majority of students are advancing into higher studies, while others are entering employment and skill-development pathways. Dropout rates remain minimal, showing the effectiveness of our sustained support and follow-up.

Overall, these achievements reaffirm the Foundation's commitment to academic excellence and educational empowerment, ensuring that education leads not just to exam success but to confidence, opportunities, and lasting change.

EDUCATIONAL AND CAREER PROGRESS OF FORMER STUDENTS (2019–2025)



Over the past seven years, Learning Point Foundation has made significant strides in improving the educational and career outcomes of madrasa students and dropouts, helping them progress into meaningful opportunities.

10th & 12th Standard Pass Rates: Consistently above 94%, with 2024–25 recording excellent results across both grades, setting the foundation for higher studies and employability.

Further Studies: In 2024–25, a remarkable 78% of students opted for further education, the highest progression rate since the program began. This steady increase reflects the growing awareness among students about the importance of higher education and professional qualifications.

Employment: Alongside academics, 18% of students successfully transitioned into employment in 2024–25, contributing to their families and communities. This balance shows the dual impact of our programs — enabling both career pathways and continued learning.

Dropout Rates: Despite the rise in student strength, dropouts have been consistently contained at 4% or less in recent years. Where dropouts occurred, reasons were primarily personal, such as early marriages or family circumstances, rather than academic challenges.

Overall Impact: From 2019–2025, hundreds of students have advanced into higher education or employment, with dropout rates kept minimal. This sustained progress underscores our commitment to empowering students with knowledge, skills, and opportunities that prepare them for brighter futures and greater contributions to society.
